





The Scenario Space in 2016






Scenarios as Departures from the Trendline






The BP Scenarios in Context





General Observations and a Few Questions



- All scenarios, even "business-as-usual", are very radical departures from the historic trendline.
- Energy demand moderation is quite extreme. Will 3 billion more people than today (and perhaps 5 billion more in the middle class) be able satisfy their ambitions?
- Rapid and Net Zero seem to be 'strong policy' and 'even stronger policy', but you do not seem to articulate a choice in *how* to reach the target.
 - What about the CCS agenda?
 - CCS only features in BECCS (but isn't all CO₂ the same)
 - CCUS is the 'U' scalable? And affordable?
- The Outlook and The Netherlands: the strong 'Klimaatakkoord' for 2030 seems Rapid-like. Even for a wealthy, well-governed nation, it's a daunting challenge to deliver on it.
